Initiative 1 of the Perth Vocations Office Strategic Plan focuses on "**Vocations Promotion at the Parochial Level."** The table below showcases how to date - starting from July 2023 - we are advancing this initiative. We also share our plans for 2024 year to further advance this important initiative.

Parish outreach:

We aim to reach out to as many parishes as possible by collaboration with seminarians at St. Charles' Seminary in Guildford, we hope this initiative will evoke vocations through priests or seminarians' sharing of their vocation's stories.

Empowering youth ministry:

In collaboration with the youth ministry programme, we aim to inspire them with the courage to contribute to the society in which they live.

Retreats and conferences:

This initiative will involve married couples, singles living a faithful committed Christian life, priests, deacons and religious sisters and brothers sharing their stories and witnesses to their different vocations.

- Promotion of Little Sisters Advent Retreat on Vocations social channels and website.
- Initial proposal presented to Clergy Wellbeing team for a Vocations focus at clergy events.
- Continue to promote retreats of religious orders and parishes.
- Establish relationships with Centre for Marriage, Life and Family and Centre for Faith Enrichment for collaboration.
- Continue to explore opportunities for Vocations inclusions in community and clergy events.







INITIATIVE 2: VOCATIONS PROMOTION IN CATHOLIC SCHOOLS AND UNIVERSITIES

Promoting a culture of vocation in Catholic schools requires its own individual approach. We will focus on year 10, 11 and 12 students as they are already considering their careers and lifestyle. This forms initiative 2 of the Vocations Office Strategy: **Vocations Promotion in Catholic Schools and Universities.**

Vocations Day Programme:

These more informal activities will provide students with the opportunity to talk about vocation in a more relaxed atmosphere. It would be most desirable to integrate this initiative into existing religious education programmes.

- Initial contact made with Tom Gourlay of UNDA Chaplaincy.
- Contact made with 24:7 Ministry.
- Contact made with St Vincent de Paul Youth Group.
- Research conducted to see if Vocations can be involved with regular events at the above and added into 2024 engagement calendar
- Formalise engagement opportunities with UNDA, 24:7 Ministry, St Vinnies.
- Establish relationship with CEWA to determine involvement opportunities.
- Develop engaging Vocations school resources for downloading via Vocations website.

Vocations Retreat Programme:

This initiative is best suited to tertiary students and apprentices. It will provide them with the opportunity to discern God's will for them in an atmosphere promoting more focused reflection.

- As per above, initial contact made with Tom Gourlay at UNDA for further engagement.
- Initial contact made with UWA and Curtin Catholic Society.
- Organise meeting with CYM, UNDA chaplaincy, UWA and Curtin societies to seek opportunities for Vocations involvement for existing retreats.
- Develop engaging Vocations university resources for downloading via Vocations website.

Vocations website:

The website is a source of information on vocations with accompanying online resources, especially for individuals who are seriously discerning their future.

- New website launched with new messaging.
- New website has the following backend scores:
 - 2000+ backlinks (a high score)
 - 40 domain authority (means website will score higher for related keyword searches)
- Religious life resources added post consultation with religious orders WA.
- Content continues to be updated for Vocations stories including with Seminarians stories.
- Finalise set up of Google Analytics for Vocations website to measure unique visits
- Continue to create stories, update websites and build resources for downloading.

Vocations Facebook:

The Vocations Office will use Facebook to share initiatives that have occurred in parishes, schools and tertiary institutions. This platform will report and amplify these initiatives and reach out to the wider on-line community to cultivate a culture of vocation.

- Facebook content calendar created for Vocations Office to allow for regular postings and sharing of stories.
- Facebook engagement results since August 2023:
 - o 30+ new followers
 - 119% engagement reach, up to 2900 people average per post
 - 867 unique profile visits to the Facebook page over this lifetime.
- Continue to create engaging Facebook post and stories including videos of seminarian stories.
- Use Facebook ads to create targeted ads for events.
- Use more videos for messaging.
- Re-share and boost St Charles Seminary FB.

INITIATIVE 4: SUSTAINING THOSE DISCERNING VOCATIONS

The priority for the Vocation Office will be to follow-up on individuals who have shown interest in the priesthood or ordained ministry. However it will also assist those interested in religious life, marriage and committed singlehood by directing them to the appropriate personnel and resources.

FOCUS

2023 ACHIEVEMENTS

Archbishop dinner:

This initiative involves the Archbishop hosting an annual dinner for potential candidates for the priesthood and religious life.

- This has not been investigated as yet.
- Plans are currently underway to invite Archbishop Timothy Costelloe SDB to provide a "Welcome" for seminarians in a high tea event in February 2024. Curia members to be invited to sit and talk to seminarians as well.
- Continue investigating opportunities for Archbishop, Bishop and Curia members to be involved in a dinner or similar style event for those discerning into ordained ministry.

Archdiocesan Vocations Conference:

This conference will focus on discussing ways in which a culture of vocations can be developed.

- A Perth Vocations Morning Tea was instead held as a form of conference, with a half a day workshop with QA, storytelling and workshop. This style was well received (see Appendix 2 for results of the event and preparation for 2024).
- In addition, the Perth Vocations team have created a calendar for regular events that contribute to an impact of a large conference. See Appendix 3 for activities calendar.
- Perth Vocations morning tea will be held twice a year to act as a conference sharing stories of Vocations in all walks of life.

 The three months discernment period has been implemented for four St Charles seminarians, including Thomas, Matthew, Daniel and Vivek.

Budget:


Formal budget submission in consultation with the Archdiocesan Finance team to fund 2024 office operations.

- Completed a zero-based budget for 2024.
- Firmed up premises and assumptions that can be reused for future budgeting exercises.
- Regular expenses vs budget reviews during the year to track progress and any adjustments necessary.
- Prepare and firm up 2025 plans, premises and assumptions needed to develop the 2025 budget before deadlines set.

Physical office set-up:

Setting up the Vocations Office at 21 Victoria Square for internal work for the Vocations and external engagements with community.

- Ergonomic and functional office furniture ordered, delivered and installed.
- Computing workstations upgraded to enable the Vocations Director and Coordinator and any visitor to work efficiently and effectively.
- After half of year of operations, to review if changes are required to the working environment.

Database | CRM for stakeholders:

Ensuring that contact details of stakeholders are recorded and follows Information Governance and Safeguarding policies.

 Adopted a temporary solution to keep track of all the new contacts and relationships forged in 2023. Research and review possible solutions for a permanent database or CRM for stakeholders of the Vocations Office.

Policies and procedures:

Office specific policies and procedures to be investigate and cross references against existing or planned suite of policies drafted.

- Reached out to key stakeholders of the Vocations Office to determine the processes, policies and procedures that should be put in place for a fully operational Vocations Office.
- Consult and confer with other Vocations Offices in Australia to benchmark the Perth Vocations with the view of understanding best practices and areas where further improvements are needed.

Vocations Coordinator appointment:

A part time Vocations Coordinator to support the implementation of the Vocations Strategic Plan.

- Vocations Coordinator position advertised and recruitment process saw the appointment of Jet Bautista as Vocations Coordinator in September 2023. Jet brings with him knowledge and familiarity of the Archdiocese as a volunteer and CAPAC staff.
- Vocations Coordinator to continue implementing the 2024 Strategic Plan and supporting Vocations Director.

Vocations Committee and Charter:

Vocations Committee is engaged to provide advice and support to Vocations Director.

- One meeting with three committee members conducted in September 2023.
- End of year committee meeting conducted in November 2023.
- Committee Charter drafted and circulated to Committee members for feedback.
- Vocations Committee regular meetings scheduled for the 2024 year.
- Charter finalised.





APPENDIX 1: VOCATIONS OFFICE COLLATERAL



Journey to St Charles' Seminary

Those who feel called to the priesthood should first contact the Vocations Director for the Archdiocese. The Director will speak with each person and suggest some program of prayer and charitable works that could be undertaken. He will also ask the prospective student to keep in contact with his parish priest as well as the Vocations Director.

At an appropriate time, if the person wishes to continue, he will be asked to make an application and to collect various documents and references which will be passed on to the Seminary Rector. Towards the end of each year, an interviewing panel meets and esch applicant is interviewed. As a result of the interview, are part is forwarded to the Archbishop who will accept, delay or refuse the applicant's request.



APPENDIX 4: VOCATIONS OFFICE MANDATE

Vocations Office Mandate

Mandate given by the Archbishop

The Vocations Office of the Archdiocese of Perth is established to cultivate a culture of vocation based on Jesus' mandate to "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations" (Mt 28:19) and "Do this in remembrance of me" (Lk 22:19; cf. 1 Cor 11:24). To fulfill Jesus' mandate, we need all the faithful to nurture God's call through their prayers and encouragement; so that every person may have the courage to say Yes to wherever God is calling them to be – married life, single blessedness, religious life, or the ordained ministry.

Purpose

- The purpose of the Vocations Office is to support anyone seeking a mature relationship with Christ, particularly those who are suitable for the priesthood/ordained ministry or religious life. The office will undertake the following:
 - Promote a culture of vocation within the Archdiocese of Perth, primarily in the parishes, schools, universities, Catholic agencies, and multicultural communities.
 - Ensure there are sufficient and appropriate initiatives to guide, encourage, and nourish people who are exploring and discerning where God is calling them.
 - Collaborate with other dioceses in Western Australia and other states to promote a national awareness of vocations.
 - Provide advice and practical guidance to enable projects and initiatives to be successfully implemented in accordance with the purpose of the Vocations Office.
 - Support prospective candidates in their practical enquiry to enter St. Charles' Seminary and ensuring that they complete the necessary requirements prior to entry to the seminary.
 - Ensure that candidates have a holistic idea of the Seminary formation programme, taking Ratio Fundamentalis Institutionis Sacerdotalis and Pastores Dabo Vobis as reference points.

Vocations Director

• The Vocations Director is appointed by the Archbishop to manage the Vocations Office and to engage in other activities relating to Vocations in the Archbishop. The Vocations Director reports to the Vicar for Clergy.



2. Validity, Scope, and Definitions

2.1. Validity

- 2.1.1. This Vocations Committee is valid by virtue of the appointment of the Vocations Director and co-terminus with his tenure, and
- 2.1.2. Remains in place as deemed by the Vocations Director, who can decide to disband the Committee, with the approval of the Archbishop or his representative..

2.2. Scope and definitions

- 2.2.1. The main role of the Committee is to assist and/or advise the Vocations Director in his role.
- 2.2.2. This Charter sets out the functions, powers, duties, and responsibilities of the Vocations Committee.
- 2.2.3. In this Charter, the following terms mean the following:

Vocations Committee 3.

3.1. Purpose of the Vocations Committee

- 3.1.1. The Vocations Committee is responsible for the following:
 - a. Providing advice to the Vocations Director when requested
 - b. Attending Vocations Committee meetings
 - c. Reviewing and proposing improvements of Vocations projects and initiatives
 - d. Reviewing and proposing improvements in the operations and administration of the Vocations Office
- 3.1.2. Advisory Role - The Vocations Committee has a purely advisory role, unless the Vocations Director decides to delegate his authority and mandate to specific members of the committee.
- 3.1.3. Vocations Committee Meeting Attendees - Unless exempted explicitly by the Vocations Director, all members of the Vocations Committee are required to attend all meetings called by the Vocations Director. These meetings would be where members are to provide advice and guidance to the Vocations Office.
- 3.1.4. Vocations Projects Oversight - The Vocations Committee will review on-going and proposed projects for the purpose of suggesting improvements in the development and execution of vocation projects.
- 3.1.5. Vocations Office Oversight - The Vocations Committee will review the operations and administration of the Vocations Office for the purpose of providing suggestions and recommendations to improve the office.

3.2. Frequency of Meetings

- 3.2.1. Meeting Frequency: The Vocations Committee will meet at least six times a year and held at the location agreed by the committee.
- 3.2.2. Standing Agenda: The Vocations Director is responsible for the meeting agenda but may delegate its preparation and distribution. The following are included in all meetings:

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3.2.3. Minutes & Reports: The Vocations Office Coordinator or a member assigned by the Vocations Director is responsible for the preparation and distribution of the meeting invitations, agenda, minutes and other reports. The following are the basic parts of the minutes:

3.3. Composition of the Vocations Committee

- 3.3.1. The Vocations Committee will be composed of 8 members including the Vocations Director. Diversity in membership would be a serious consideration in the composition of the Vocations Committee members.
- 3.3.2. If the Committee needs additional members, nominations will be received from the current Committee members themselves. Final selection will be done by the Vocations Director.
- 3.3.3. The current membership of the Committee can be found in Appendix I. This appendix shall be updated when changes to the Committee are made.

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4. Decision Making

4.1. Consensus

5. (Re)-appointment, Term, and Resignation

5.1. Appointment and Term

- 5.1.1. The Vocations Director is appointed directly by the Archbishop.
- 5.1.2. The Vocations Committee members are nominated and approved by the Vocations Director.
- 5.1.3. The Vocations Director is normally appointed for a three (3) year term but subject to extension.
- 5.1.4. Vocations Committee Members have no set terms and can be reappointed.

5.2. Resignations

- 5.2.1. All members of the Vocations Committee can opt to resign.
- 5.2.2. Vacancies from resignations will be replaced through recommendations of the members and approved by the Director.

6. Amendment

6.1. Amendment

6.1.1. This Committee Charter may be amended by the Vocations Director and would need approval from the Archbishop before the changes take effect.

Governing law

7.1. Governing Law

7.1.1. This Charter shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the state of Western Australia.

7.2. Consistency

7.2.1. This Charter is based on the policies and charters governing the Archdiocese of Perth. In the event of inconsistency between this present Charter and the Archdiocese of Perth governing regulations and rules, the latter shall prevail.
